2.1 Academic Reform and Curriculum Modernization

In 2025, CSPU further developed the Pedagogical Education Innovation Cluster model and introduced an Individual Approach to Learning system.

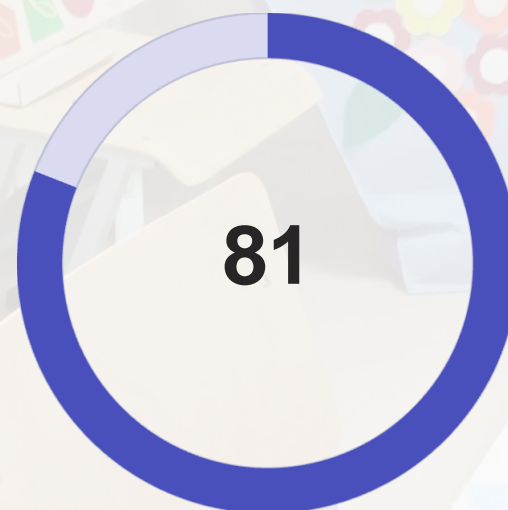
2.5 Academic Mobility and Internationalization

Faculty Mobility



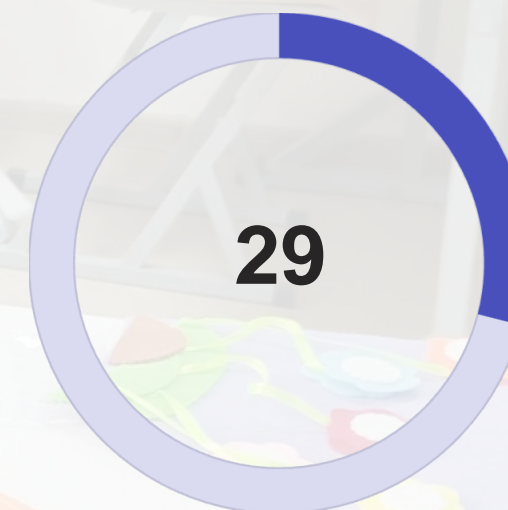
International Visits

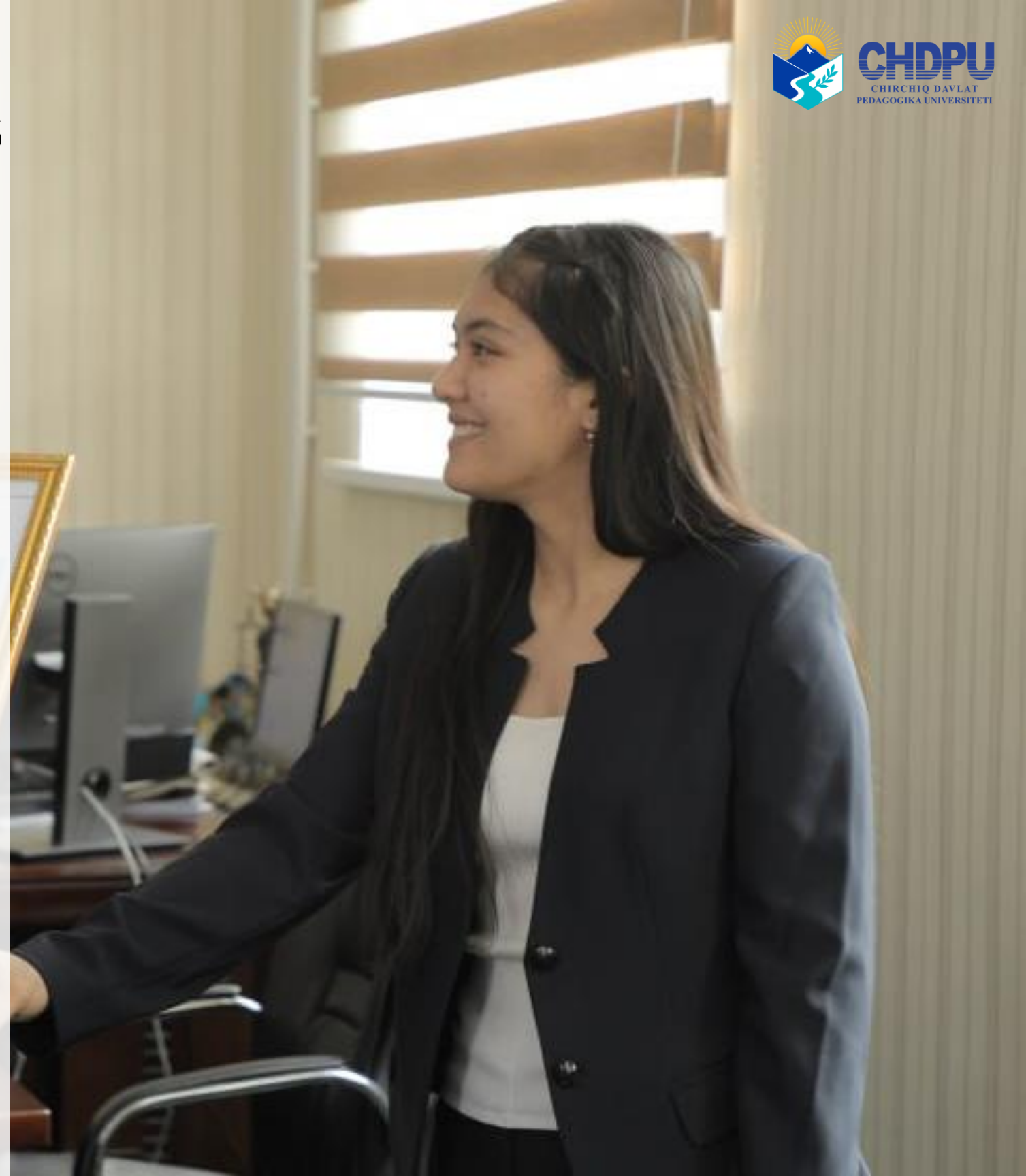
